Annual school photos have been taken by Arthur Reed Photos.

To view the images of your child and order photos, you will need to first register online.

- 1. Go to https://order.arphotos.com.au and enter the 2023 image code for your child (from their personalized flyer)
- 2. Tap on 'Add another child' to enter the image codes of any siblings
- 3. Fill in your email and mobile details and then review all details before confirming your registration

That's it! When 2023 photos are ready, you will be notified by email and SMS. Even if you registered last year, it's important that you do it again each year using your child's new image code to link their photos for the current year with your contact details.

To ensure you are ordering school photos for the current year, please wait for notifications that 2023 images are online before placing orders.

In the webshop you can view photos and customize your photo package; Choose ANY layout, ANY image and purchase multiple digital image downloads.

This week we are celebrating National Reconciliation Week in our classrooms. We are learning about and celebrating our Aboriginal culture and history.



ABORIGINAL LEARNING

Reconciliation Week occurs from Saturday 27th May to Saturday 3rd June.

At Mossfiel Primary School, our whole school has been involved in acknowledging and celebrating our Aboriginal culture and history, as well as discussing the meaning of Reconciliation Week.

In classrooms, students have been viewing, reading and sharing special Aboriginal stories.

They have been exploring Aboriginal art and creating their own Aboriginal-inspired art (please see some art samples below).

Some students and staff have also brought along their own special Aboriginal artefacts from home, including Aboriginal clothing, pot plants and boomerangs. Mr Maisey even brought along his didgeridoo, which was created by an Aboriginal artist.

It has also been wonderful to see some of our classroom teachers making acknowledgements in their classroom with their students. You can see an example below of an acknowledgement that Mrs Wojtas is practising with her class, featuring the beautiful Aboriginal artwork of one of our Year 1/2 students.


We would also like to thank some of our students for speaking at assembly last Friday, explaining the meaning of Reconciliation Week and ways that we can learn about this significant time of the year.

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

CSEF APPLICATIONS NOW DUE

CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - General eligibility

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one
- · on the first day of Term two
- a) be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards OR be a temporary foster parent, and:
- b) submit an application to the school by the due date.

For the list of eligible financially-means tested cards refer to the CSEF Policy: https://www2.education.vic.gov.au/pal/camps-sports-and-excursions-fund/policy

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with the above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

Special Consideration

A special consideration category exists for

- Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families
- Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/carer concession card being validated successfully with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (30 January 2023) or term two (24 April 2023).

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents/carers so please register your interest at the school.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

Complete the PARENT/CARER DETAILS section.

Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.

If you are claiming as a temporary Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.

If you are seeking special consideration, mark this in the form and provide a copy of the relevant documentation.

- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2023 closes on the 23 June 2023.
